CARP-How big is the problem?

South Center Lake is an 835-acre lake in Chisago County, MN and managed primarily for walleye and northern pike fishing. The lake is a popular recreational lake and receives high angler pressure. Fisheries surveys have been conducted every five years from 1985 until 2015. Common carp first appeared in these surveys starting in 2000 but were first detected in a 1995 fisheries survey of North Center Lake, which connects to South Center via a connection under US Highway 8. Although common carp do not appear until the 1990's, they are believed to have entered the lake after a high water period in 1986.

Carp are one of the most damaging aquatic invasive species due to its wide distribution and severe impacts in shallow lakes and wetlands. Their feeding disrupts shallowly rooted plants and muddies the water. They release phosphorus that increases algae abundance. Carp induced declines in water quality causes declines of aquatic plants needed by waterfowl and fish.
